TAKE NOTICE than an application will be made by the applicants before the presiding Judge at the Courthouse at 800 Smithe Street, Vancouver, BC, V6Z 2E1 on Thursday, the 21st day of August, 2014 at 9:45 a.m. for the Orders set out in Part 1 below.

Part 1: ORDER(S) SOUGHT

- 1. An Order in the form of Order attached hereto as Schedule "A" authorizing the Petitioners to take all steps necessary to implement the terms of a settlement agreement with, *inter alia*, Concentra Financial Services Corporation, Concentra Trust and 3L Cattle Company Ltd.
- 2. Such further and other relief as this Honourable Court may order.

Part 2: FACTUAL BASIS

- 1. On June 21, 2012, the Honourable Mr. Justice Grauer pronounced an Initial Order in these proceedings pursuant to the provisions of the *Companies' Creditors Arrangement Act*, R.S.C. 1985, c. C-36, as amended, which granted relief, including, inter alia, a stay of proceedings until 11:59 p.m. on July 20, 2012.
- 2. On July 20, 2012, the Petitioners applied for, and were granted, an extension of the relief in the Initial Order, including the stay of proceedings, to September 28, 2012. That relief has been extended by a series of subsequent orders and currently expires on November 30, 2014.
- 3. On May 21, 2014 Mr. Justice Grauer granted an order permitting the Petitioners to call a meeting of their creditors to vote on a Plan (the "Meeting Order").
- 4. The Meeting Order also contained certain declarations in respect of a claim made by Concentra Financial Services Association and Concentra Trust. That claim is based upon a promissory note (the "Opco Note") that was given by Lemare Lake Logging Ltd. and others.
- 5. The Petitioners held a meeting of the Trade Creditors on July 8, 2014 to vote on the Plan.
- 6. The Plan was unanimously approved by the Trade Creditors.
- 7. It is a condition of the Plan that the Petitioners obtain the declarations sought in respect of the Opco Note. The Plan cannot be implemented until any appeals from that aspect of the Meeting Order have been resolved.
- 8. Concentra Financial Services Association obtained leave to appeal the declaration aspect of Meeting Order and the appeal is scheduled to be heard on August 14, 2014.
- 9. A comprehensive multi-party settlement has been reached between the Petitioners, Concentra Financial Services Association and Concentra Trust, 3L Cattle Company Ltd. and others (the "Settlement").
- 10. The Settlement provides both financing for and a structure to effect a wind-up of a Retirement Compensation Agreement that is the basis for the \$10 million claim against the Petitioners under the Opco Note. In addition the Settlement effects a resolution of all outstanding disputes between the Petitioners and their principals on the one hand, and 3L Cattle Company Ltd. its principal and certain other related companies on the other hand.
- 11. The Petitioners intend to apply for a Sanction Order approving the Plan and will then be in a position to make payments to the Trade Creditors in accordance with the Plan.
- 12. It is anticipated that the Settlement will close on or before September 15, 2014.
- 13. The Settlement contemplates inter alia that the Petitioners (or one more of them) will:

- (a) discharge the existing mortgage held over the Saskatchewan ranch lands owned by 3L Cattle Company Ltd. and a related General Security Agreement;
- (b) advance by way of a \$100,000 loan to 3L Cattle Company Ltd.;
- (c) obtain an new mortgage over the Saskatchewan ranch lands owned by 3L Cattle Company Ltd. in the amount of \$1.3 million to replace in part the existing mortgage and to secure the new \$100,000 advance;
- (d) permit a new mortgage in favour of Concentra Financial Services Association in the amount of \$1.5 million to be registered in priority to the \$1.3 million mortgage to be held by the Petitioners;
- (e) execute a comprehensive mutual release between the Petitioners and their principals on the one hand, and 3L Cattle Company Ltd., its principal and certain other related companies on the other hand;
- (f) execute certain limited indemnities between the Petitioners and their principals on the one hand, and 3L Cattle Company Ltd., its principal and certain other related companies on the other hand; and
- (g) be released from all liabilities under the Opco Note.
- 14. The resolution of the Petitioners' obligations under the Opco Note is the only obstacle to the Petitioners being able to implement the Plan, pay the Trade Creditors and successfully exit from CCAA protection. The implementation of the Settlement will allow that to happen.

Part 3: LEGAL BASIS

- 1. Companies' Creditors Arrangement Act, R.S.C. 1985, c. C-36, as amended, and in particular ss. 11, 11.02 and 19 thereof; and
- 2. The inherent jurisdiction of this Honourable Court.
