AFFIDAVIT

I, Amarjit Singh Lalli, orchardist, of 1900 Mckenzie Road, Kelowna, British Columbia, AFFIRM
THAT:

1. I am an orchardist in the Okanagan region of British Columbia and a voting member of the BC Tree Fruits Cooperative (the "BCTFC"), one of the petitioners in these proceedings. I have been a voting member of the BCTFC since 2005. I am also a former board member of the BCTFC, serving on the BCTFC board from 2016 to 2022. I am familiar with the BCTFC business, its management structure, and its voting members (the "Growers"). As such, I have personal knowledge of the matters deposed to herein. Where I have relied on other sources of information, I have so stated and I believe them to be true.
2. Capitalized terms used but not otherwise defined in this affidavit shall have the meanings given to them in the Order of the Honourable Madam Justice Gropper (the "Initial Order"), granted August 13, 2024, pursuant to the *Companies' Creditors Arrangement Act*, R.S.C. 1985, c. C-36 ("CCAA").

3. This affidavit is made in support of an application by me, on behalf of a majority group of the Growers (the “**Ad-Hoc Growers**”), for an order under the CCAA:
 - (a) appointing Osler, Hoskin & Harcourt LLP (“**Osler**”) as representative counsel for the Ad-Hoc Growers in these CCAA proceedings;
 - (b) granting a charge in the amount of \$100,000 over the Property of the Petitioners in respect of the Ad-Hoc Growers’ anticipated legal fees to participate in these CCAA proceedings (the “**Growers’ Charge**”); and
 - (c) ranking the Growers’ Charge in priority after the Directors’ Charge.
4. The Ad-Hoc Growers are 98 of the 174 voting Growers in the BCTFC, representing approximately 56% of the BCTFC’s total voting membership. A true copy of a letter signed by each of the Ad-Hoc Growers in support of appointing Osler as representative counsel is attached hereto as **Exhibit A**. We did not have access to a membership list and were unable to discuss with everyone.
5. 65 of the Ad-Hoc Growers are from the BCTFC’s “North” region and 33 of the Ad-Hoc Growers are from the BCTFC’s “South” region. The Ad-Hoc Growers delivered approximately 28,000,000 pounds of apples to the BCTFC last year, representing approximately 50% of the BCTFC’s total quantity of apples for the year.

A. BCTFC Board and Management Issues

6. Beginning in or around 2022, tensions escalated between the Ad-Hoc Growers and the BCTFC’s executives and board of directors (the “**Board**”). As of November 22, 2022, the Board had a 36% approval rating amongst Growers.
7. BCTFC governance has been a divisive issue that, based on my review of the materials filed in these CCAA proceedings, has not been put before the Court. The Board’s initiation of these CCAA proceedings does not reflect the differing views amongst the Growers.

B. Key Properties for Grower Operations

8. Four of the BCTFC's real estate properties are essential for the Growers to process and market their 2024 harvest. These properties are:
 - (a) 3335 & 3345 Sexsmith Road, Kelowna, BC (the "**Sexsmith Property**");
 - (b) 9718 Bottom Woodlake Road, Lake Country, BC (the "**Woodlake Property**");
 - (c) 327, Co-op Ave, Oliver, BC (the "**Co-op Ave Property**"); and
 - (d) 334 Packing House Lane, Oliver, BC (the "**Packing House Lane Property**")(collectively, the "**Key Properties**").
9. The Sexsmith Property is a receiving station. Growers ship the majority of all tree fruit harvests to the Sexsmith Property before the fruit is directed to other facilities. The Sexsmith Property also houses controlled atmosphere ("**CA**") storage equipment, which is used to preserve certain tree fruits (primarily apples) before they are processed and released to market. The Sexsmith Property has over 20,000 bins of CA capacity and over 10,000 bins of standard capacity. It also is a storage center for empty bins.
10. The Woodlake Property stores bins and includes over 33,000 bins of CA capacity. It is also used as a receiving station and houses empty bins.
11. The Co-op Ave Property and the Packing House Lane Property (collectively, the "**Oliver Properties**") are used in conjunction to operate a packing line for apples, cherries, and soft fruits. The Oliver Properties provide bin storage, cold storage, sorting equipment, and packing equipment.
12. BCTFC has an estimated 140,000 apple and 20,000 plastic bins worth approximately \$200 each and the Growers need about 90,000 to keep operations going.
13. The majority of all Grower production is processed through the Key Properties every year.

C. Impact of BCTFC Shutdown on Growers

14. A shutdown of the BCTFC, particularly the Key Properties, would be irreversibly devastating to the Growers.
15. The BCTFC facilities, particularly the Key Properties, allow the Growers to:
 - (a) process their tree fruit harvests for market; and
 - (b) stabilize market prices by holding and preserving large quantities of harvested tree fruits for significant lengths of time.
16. For example, the BCTFC's CA storage is essential for the Growers' apple crops. CA storage preserves apples, allowing the Growers to avoid flooding the market with the entire apple harvest at the beginning of each harvest season, which would collapse prices.
17. The Ad-Hoc Growers are not aware of any viable alternative for the BCTFC's CA storage capacity this season.
18. Some British Columbia tree fruit growers have their own facilities to process and package tree fruit harvests (the "**Private Packers**"). The Growers can engage Private Packers to process certain harvests, but Private Packers:
 - (a) do not have sufficient processing capacity for Grower production levels;
 - (b) operate on Agricultural Land Reserve (ALR) zoned properties, and therefore are not legally permitted to increase processing capacity beyond certain prescribed thresholds;
 - (c) offer limited CA storage; and
 - (d) the Private Packers will pack their own fruits first which may compromise the fruits of other Growers if there is a lack of storage.
19. Further, many of the Ad-Hoc Growers have experienced significant challenges working with Private Packers, including price gouging, stolen fruit, and food safety violations.

20. The Ad-Hoc Growers estimate that a majority of their remaining 2024 harvest could not be processed and would spoil if forced to rely solely on Private. Notably, the harvest has just started so it is difficult to estimate the potential loss at this point.
21. The BCTFC is an essential and stabilizing force. The Ad-Hoc Growers are concerned that if BCTFC facilities are not available to process significant portions of the 2024 tree fruit harvest, then many Growers (already facing financial pressures due to increased interest rates) will be forced to close.


D. Amounts Owed by BCTFC to Growers

22. Growers send their tree fruit harvests to the BCTFC, and in exchange, the BCTFC pays Growers four monetary advances each calendar year (the “**Grower Payments**”, each a “**Grower Payment**”). The Grower Payments have been completed for all fruits other than apples. The estimated crop value for apples in 2023 was approximately \$8.3 million dollars, which was planned to be distributed to the Growers in four payments throughout the course of 2024. In 2024, the Growers received three payments, but the fourth payment is still owing. The revolving fund also needs to be paid back to the growers.
23. The Growers have not received substantial payment for any soft fruits or cherries delivered to BCTFC in 2024, and would typically have received payments for these crops by this point in the season.



We write to you as a member of the BC Tree Fruits Cooperative, and in regard to the Companies' Creditors Arrangement Act proceedings of the Cooperative.





